Post-Pandemic U: Going to School for Our New World

Everything is different now. Thom Rainer, in his book, *The Post-Quar*antine Church, talks about moments in our lives when everything changed— JFK's assassination, MLK's assassination, Challenger exploding, 9/11, and more—and the folks who lived through those events remember exactly what they were doing and where they were when they happened. In the wake of each of these tragedies, Rainer suggests, one of the things everyone did was gather to mourn and process what had changed. But COVID was different. Instead of gathering, we were told to isolate. Instead of having a concrete moment, we had weeks and then months and now years of the pandemic... and it's still not over. Instead of having a gathering place for the tragedy, the millions who have died in the pandemic are spread out in time and geography. Our society will feel the ripples for decades to come—children a year or more behind in school, work that has new options, a new baby boom. In some ways, the pandemic seems to have turbo-charged trends that were already at work. For most of January and February, we will explore how our lives are different, how our relationship with God has new possibilities, and how our church has new opportunities in the wake of the pandemic. We will work our way through Thom Rainer's book, The Post-Quarantine Church, and have discussions together about how God might be calling us to deeper, freer, and more meaningful life with Jesus and each other. Can't wait to see what God does with us!



- 4. There were some structural issues in the basement of the parsonage that were able be corrected as well.


