This system is intended for use in Fellowship Hall and for outdoor events (like Porchfest), but we had a growing whine from interference from the cellular antenna. "What Can I Do to Add Energy?"

We are so glad you asked! You could really help us grow into the future! Here are some quick ideas:

- 1. Come to worship! It's the best thing we do for God, for each other, and for ourselves! Worship realigns our lives, so that all that we are and all that we do has more grace.
- 2. Find something that feeds your heart and the heart of your family. If it's Bible study, great! If it's helping with Sunday School, wonderful! Maybe we need to start some new groups or events? We let some things go during COVID, and it's time to make things new!
- **3. Find a regular way of helping our fellowship** for 1–2 hours each week.
 - Office help. Before COVID, our office help was working 15 hours a week, and we chose not to fill that position, so we have lots to do around the office each week: bulletin boards that need updating, papers to copy, files to organize, sign-up sheets to update, reminders to send out, music to print and organize and more
 - Cleaning help. Before COVID, our custodial staff was working 10 hours a week, and we chose to cut those hours in half, so we have lots of cleaning to do each week that our cleaning person doesn't have time to do.
 - Yard help. We have lots of weeding, trimming, and care that needs doing around the church and parsonage.
 - **Fixing help.** We have lots of minor fix-it tasks around the church and parsonage: repairing tables and chairs, fixing gutters, replacing shutters, getting outlets to work, putting in doorstops, fixing soap dispensers, replacing light bulbs and thermostat batteries, etc.



- **4.** Help with one or more of our summer's big events. These are some of the ways we are going to be a blessing to our community:
 - Porchfest is June 25. Ellen Ogilvie and Judi Buckley are organizing that. We still need help setting up and cleaning up.
 - July 4th Float. Allison Williams is helping with that. We will need volunteers in the design and preparation departments, and then lots of help the morning of.
 - Vacation Bible School. Tina Rychalsky is directing again this year. We need help from decorating to leading stations to being a group leader and going around with the kids.
- **5.** Read the Bible and spend time in prayer. Does this sound odd? But it's true! As you think about God, you make space for the Holy Spirit to work in your life, and that makes all of what we do together better!

Critical Needs at ISS

Inter-faith Social Services (ISS) is Quincy's oustanding, integrated services organization. (For more information, see elsewhere on this page. Here are the critical needs for donations this month:

Tuna Canned meat Cereal or oatmeal Peanut butter & jelly Healthy snacks for kids Juice boxes Shelf-stable milk, Rice Canned soup Mac & Cheese Canned fruit or vegetables Dry or canned beans Condiments (incl. salt & pep) Salad dressing Gluten-free foods Low-sodium canned items Cooking oil / Olive oil Diapers (size 4, 5 & 6) Baby wipes Personal care items: toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap (unscented), shampoo, wash

Sound System in Need of Upgrading

Our sanctuary sound system is aging and not up to how dynamic our worship could be. Parts of the system date back to the 1960s or 1970s. The remainder of the system was purchased by our previous pastor, Rev. Mike Robertson, 12–15 years ago. While some of this may have been adequate for then, we are running into some major issues.

- 1. Wireless Interference. Ten years ago, the broadcast frequency spectrum was changed. These changes made all our wireless mics useless—they get bleed through from emergency channels like the fire station.
- 2. Old amplifier not shielded against the cellular antenna. That whine we had until recently (See "Thank You, Trustees!" above) was just going to get worse. The older amplifier wasn't designed for this environment.
- 3. Growing cord hazard.

- **4. Not enough microphone jacks** and pick-ups. Only one good mic.
- **5. Better sound for online livestreaming.** Not just for Sunday worship, but for community events and special occasions (weddings, baptisms, funerals, etc)
- **6. Hearing assistance devices.** Everybody should be able to hear better.
- **7. Ease of use.** Since we want our space to be used by outside groups, we want them to be able to use the sound easily.

Having a professionally installed sound system will make such a difference in our worship service. For one thing, it will mean people will be able to hear better, and what they hear will be better sound quality—and so much of what we do is about listening and hearing. For another thing, because a professionally installed sound system just works, leaders and worshipers don't have to wonder what mic goes where, or be distracted by wondering if one of the ushers is going to trip on a wire, or will the sound work for this speaker at this place. The goal is for our worship of Jesus Christ— not the sound system—to be front and center and the focus of what we do!
