Seeking Peace, Finding God

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." —Jesus, The Bible, John 14:27

When I was a teenager, I got into a "discussion" with my mom. We each had issues with the other, and I got so angry that I said some things I shouldn't have, stormed out of the room, ran upstairs and slammed the door to my bedroom. I was so mad! But after I cooled down, I thought about we she had said, and I thought about what I had said, and I had this gnawing feeling that things were not right between us. I had to try to make things right. I just couldn't stand the idea of our relationship staying broken.

The last few years, I have had that same gnawing feeling of things not being right. Anyone else really bothered by how divisive and partisan our times are? Anyone else appalled because of how much "trolling" happens online—and then horrified when you hear someone say it out loud in real life? Anyone else ever been with a group and having fun, but all the while you're worried that someone is going to bring up politics? I believe there is

a way out of our mess, and I believe Jesus can teach it to us. I believe that Jesus can heal the brokenness we have inside, and help us heal the brokenness in our world.

All this fall, we are going to focus in on what Jesus has to say about forgiveness, about loving each other, and most of all about how (with



God's help!) we can be peacemakers in our families and neighborhood.

I have learned since my fight with my mom, that that sense of things not being right, that's something God gives us so that we will be motivated to change. Not long after I cooled down, I found my mom and apologized. And we made up, and things were right between us again—we were back on track. I believe Jesus can help us get "back on track" with God, and with each other...and that Jesus has a "toolkit" for how we can help people in our family and neighborhood do the same.

Reconciling Places: How to Bridge the Chasms in Our Communities. By Paul A. Hoffman. 2020. The author helps us understand how true healing and reconciliation for communities is rooted in God's love, and how Jesus' sacrifice shows us how grace can open the door.

Christ in Crisis: Why We Need to Reclaim Jesus. By Jim Wallis. 2019. As a follower of Jesus, Jim looks at our current politics and says, "Don't go left; don't go right; go deeper." He shows us how focusing on Jesus' core messages and questions can challenge our society's tendency towards lack of grace, and help us find new ways—Jesus' ways!—to interact with each other.

One of the life-changing aspects of Vacation Bible School each year is that together with the kids, we try to make a difference in our community and the world. This year, the kids and our



Do you know any kids who have lots of drama? The South Shore School of Theater has just moved out of Eastern




